Dear Homeowner,

The fire authority has been providing free smoke alarms to the public for just about 20-years now. These alarms have been funded solely on federal grants, private grants, and in-kind donations. Over the past 3-years there has been a change in the type of alarm we typically install from battery operated to hardwired. There has also been a change in the ages of homes and their size. This has impacted our funding for alarms due to the increased number of alarms required in newer dwellings, and their significantly higher cost.

As of January 31, 2020, the fire authority will only be able to provide **three (3)** free hardwired smoke alarms per install. That does not mean we still can't help. If your residence has more than 3 alarms, additional alarms can be purchased at the Home Depot or online if you prefer. All Kidde hard-wired smoke alarms interact with one another, including carbon monoxide/smoke alarms.

Our firefighters will gladly install our provided alarms and those purchased by you. (See model information below)
