RULES FOR OPEN BURNING IN THE CITY of BRIGHTON

Is open burning allowed?

Under certain circumstances, <u>small</u> (3' diameter by 2' high) recreational fires (campfires) are allowed as long as they are:

- Contained in a metal outdoor fireplace or some other non-combustible container
- Using only seasoned dried fire wood
- Kept at least 25' from any structures or combustible materials (house, shed, garage, wood fence, deck, etc.)
- Provide a means that will keep the fire from spreading to within 25' of structures (garden hose turned on, shovels, metal rakes, etc.)

Can I burn yard waste or trash?

No, under no circumstances can household trash, construction materials or yard waste (leaves, twigs, branches, etc.) be burned.

Can I have a larger bon fire?

No. However, bon fires may be allowed for religious ceremonies or special events. A permit must be obtained from the Fire Department to have a bon fire.

At no time is the use of accelerants (flammable or combustible liquids) allowed to start or increase the burning of any open burning.

All fires that are considered to be objectionable or complained about must be extinguished. The Fire Department must respond to and act upon all open burning complaints.
