Purpose: It is the intention of this scholarship to aid in financial support by awarding <u>one</u> (1) graduating senior a \$1,000.00 scholarship to go towards the financing of their education.

The winner will be chosen by a committee from a pool of applicants from Livingston County Public and Private High Schools; as well as Fenton, Milford and South Lyon High Schools.

Eligibility: Applicants must be accepted into an approved college or university of higher learning for the beginning of the fall semester immediately following their graduation from high school.

Applicants <u>must</u> be considering a career in one of the following areas: <u>Fire Services,</u> <u>Emergency Medical Services, Law Enforcement or Public Administration.</u>

The winning applicant will be selected with an emphasis on personal and scholastic achievement, as well as financial need, and personal qualities.
