# Station 33 Construction Update

Chief provided an update on the construction of Fire Station 33

- The exterior brick veneer is almost completed.
- Roofing contractor began installation of the roofing.
- Delays are anticipated on electrical equipment and the general contractor is working with the electrical contractor on some different options.
- The exterior will be temporarily enclosed to begin to thaw out the inside area to install the concrete Floor.
- Pole barn shell is complete.
- Generator won't be available till late October 2022.
- Re: Easement to the east of Station 33:
  - o Tom Mitchell has agreed to relocate the telephone pole & guy wire.
  - O Complete transfer agreement for review by the attorney.
  - O Complete language for the property as well as a new plot map.

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#### FYE 2023 Budgetary Goals & Discussion

Chief O'Brian stated that he should have a preliminary DRAFT budget to the board at the April meeting with the final budget being presented to the board for approval in May.

With inflation at an all time high we are seeing the cost of everything from food, fuel, energy, equipment, parts, as well as fire trucks increasing at an alarming rate. We currently have 3 vehicles that are due for replacement according to our capital replacement plan: a Tanker (who's life has already been extended by 5 years) and 2 Rescues. We are trying to hold out as long as we can but we'll inevitably be spending more on repairs, as the vehicles age.

Recruitment and retention has been a major priority for BAFA and keeping our paid-on-call numbers up has become increasingly difficult. Our paid-on-call personnel numbers are dwindling due to a number of factors and it's becoming harder to retain trained fire personnel. Senior administration will be evaluating wages, benefits, and cost of living. They plan to meet with the personnel committee to come up with a plan to meet today's demands and remain competitive in order to recruit and retain the best possible candidates.

#### Good of the Order

The Pierce Rescue 31 which suffered an electrical fire back in August of 2021 will be towed to Wisconsin in the next 30 days for the extensive repair. They estimate the work will be completed in August 2022.
