## Discussion and Update on Station 33 Easements

Staff has continued to work with Harris & Literski on the completion of the easement as it relates to Fire Station 33. The updated easements have been completed by Boss Engineering and Harris and Literksi.

Much of the work has been completed with the various interested parties and the State of Michigan and it should be ready for signature in the near future.

### Request Approval of 2025 Health Care Renewal

Brighton Area Fire Authority has reached a couple of major milestones in our Healthcare Program. Since the passing of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act in 2010, BAFA has now reached the measurement standard of an Applicable Large Employer which requires an expanded level of compliance and required reporting. The second milestone is with our increased staffing, BAFA now has the opportunity to provide our staff with multiple healthcare options instead of a singular plan option. This allows an employee to select a plan option that best fits their needs. With the changes sited above, Administration is recommending the following changes to our May 1st renewal:

- ▶ BCN HSA HMO (\$2500/\$5000) will be replaced with BCN POS HSA Gold as Option 1 in our plan offerings. This plan option will offer a similar Employer HSA contribution of 50% of deductible, Single 1250/yr or Two+ \$2500/yr. However, employee cost sharing will increase to Single-\$172/mo. EE + 1-\$276/mo. Family-\$290/mo.
- > Option 2- BCN HMO HSA Gold (\$3300/\$6600). Employer HSA contribution, Single-\$1,000/yr or Two+ \$2,000/yr. Employee cost sharing will remain at current levels, Single-\$90/mo. EE+1-\$190/mo. Family-\$204/mo.
- > Option 3- BCN HMO HSA Bronze (\$7,500/\$15,000). Employees will not be responsible for any cost sharing under this plan and no Employer HSA contribution will be offered. Employees may contribute to their HSA account via payroll deduction.
- > Brighton Area Fire Authority's healthcare contributions are estimated to be \$83,617 below the State of Michigan 2025 Hardcap.

# Presentation of DRAFT Operating & Capital Budget for fye June 30, 2026

Chief O'Brian presented the DRAFT of the proposed Operating & Capital budgets for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026 highlighting the items below:

The following assumptions were made:

- 2.5% raise for all Authority Staff including Robin Hunt and BAFA Board.
- Continuation of wages for staffing of four fire stations and paid on call wages.
- Increase in related costs to vehicle and building maintenance.
- Continuation of current programs such as training, community risk reduction and Howell High School program.

#### Capital expenditures include:

- FYE 2027 Engine replacement purchase
- Solutions for waterway emergencies
- Continuation of radio replacement program
- Consideration for airpack replacement program
- Multiple building renovations/repairs and Station 31 addition

#### Good of the Order

• Northern Michigan was recently impacted by a severe weather disaster, resulting in widespread damage, including downed trees and power lines. This has caused significant disruptions to power supply and accessibility throughout the affected region.

Assistant Chief Tester and Battalion Chief Brookins were deployed to the disaster area assisting with logistics and facilitating access to fuel and supplies. They returned yesterday and Deputy Chief Siriani headed up there last night to offer his assistance in the recovery operations. Mike Evans who is part of the Incident Management Team (IMT) has also been on scene.

Brian Gramza and TJ Smith have been working in conjunction with operations teams to clear debris and open access to streets. This is crucial to enable power companies to access and repair damaged infrastructure, facilitating power restoration efforts. They were also sent to Mackinac Island to assist in their recovery efforts.

- Staff is gearing up for Brighton's busy summer event schedule.
- Vista at Uptown, which is the new 4 story building on Second Street, is nearing completion. Fire
  Marshal Boisvert along with staff will be doing a walk-thru in order to give them their certificate of
  occupancy.
- Staff is doing a great job managing the challenges of all the freeway construction and lane closures.
